On behalf of tens of thousands of people with disabilities, including many veterans, SourceAmerica commends the ongoing dedication of the House Committee on Veterans' Affairs to improving the lives of America's veterans and advancing critical health care reforms. Today, we respectfully urge you to forward the bipartisan H.R. 1336, the Veterans' National Traumatic Brain Injury Treatment Act, to the House floor for consideration.

Traumatic brain injury and post-traumatic stress disorder are often referred to as "signature injuries" of modern military conflicts, impacting tens of thousands of servicemembers and veterans. Despite the Department of Veterans Affairs' efforts, many veterans with TBI or PTSD continue to face significant barriers in accessing specialized and effective treatments tailored to their injuries. Many of these injuries lead either directly or indirectly to suicide. We have a duty to examine alternative therapies to help reduce the suicide rate among veterans.

As you know, H.R. 1336 takes a decisive step forward by creating a national framework to expand access to evidence-based, individualized rehabilitation therapies for TBI and PTSD. This bill will promote an innovative treatment option for our nation's veterans.

We strongly believe that H.R. 1336 provides tools, resources, and incentives to transform the landscape of TBI/PTSD treatment for veterans through donations from the public and, when necessary, appropriate funds by the VA. By supporting this legislation, the American people can ensure that our veterans who are living with the lifelong effects of brain injuries are offered hope, healing, and a chance at an improved quality of life.

SourceAmerica's collective experience working with individuals with disabilities, including veterans with service-connected injuries, has shown that comprehensive and timely intervention is critical to successful recovery and reintegration into civilian life. H.R. 1336 answers that call by focusing on veteran-centered care and innovation.



We respectfully urge Congress to prioritize H.R. 1336 and its passage in the 119th Congress. Our veterans deserve the highest standard of care and opportunity for recovery with alternative therapies, which requires our full commitment.
